**Tasting Notes:** Pale pink in color, the 2009 Pinot Noir Blanc has ample fruit aromas of strawberries, tangerine and watermelon rind, as well as hints of fresh flowers. On the palate, the flavors mirror the aromas on the nose. The 2.6% residual sugar gives it a slight hint of sweetness, while the acid helps the wine finish clean, light and refreshing.

**Fun Facts:** Our Pinot Noir Blanc is similar to an old French method of producing light colored Pinot Noir wines, in which the Pinot Noir grapes are lightly pressed, only allowing the juice to pick up a small trace of color from the dark skins. Traditionally found in the Champagne region of France, this wine style, known as 'Oeil de Perdrix', or 'the Eye of the Partridge', was the most popular style of wine in the region, before the Champenois became famous for sparkling wines.
