Tasting Notes: This is our second concurrent release of Vintage Select Pinot Noir grown at the Gensler vineyard above White Salmon, WA. This year's release has a more concentrated strawberry and dark berry fruit core highlighted by cedar, vanilla and oak spice. Smooth tannins and bright acidity extend a long open finish.

Food Friends: The easiest way to pair wine and food is by matching the regional cuisine with regional wines. Oregon has an abundance of mushrooms, hazelnuts, pork, duck, and salmon... all of which compliment Pinot Noir.

Fun Facts: One of the most temperamental grapes to grow, Pinot Noir requires a long, cool growing season to get fully mature, making it a frustrating grape from which to make wine, and often exhibiting a large range between high and low quality.
